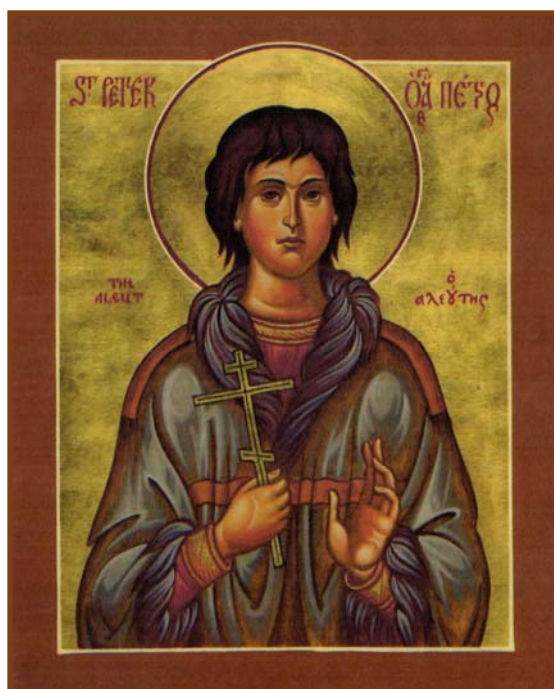

Welcome to the St. Peter the Aleut Orthodox youth camp.

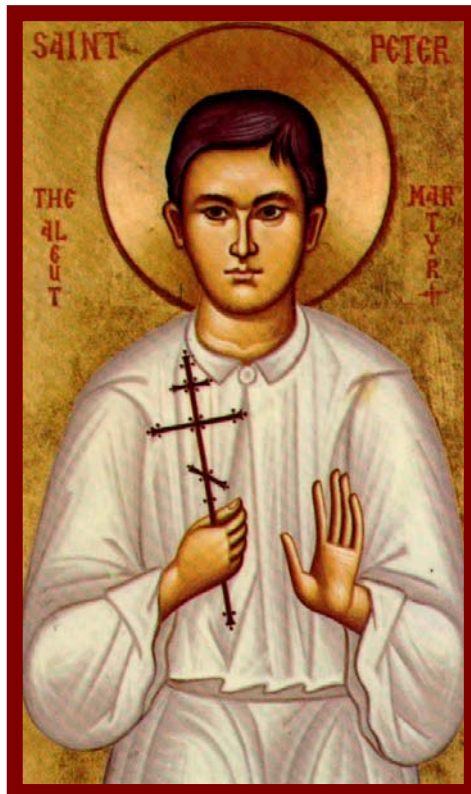
We thank all clergy, volunteers and staff for donating their time and efforts towards the edification of our youth.

GUIDELINES

Activity Coordinator Guidelines

1. Discuss planned activities and camp schedule with directors.
2. Scheduling of all approved activities
3. Oversee the safety of campers in all planned activities
4. Posting of schedule by 5pm the day before including any approved changes.
5. Notification of schedule change with all staff.

Counselor Guidelines

1. Your primary responsibility is the campers. This includes: conduct, health, safety, hygiene, promptness to services and activities.
2. Maintain visual contact of campers at all times—campers are not to be left unattended day or night
3. Maintain a positive and mature atmosphere by setting an example to the campers

Kitchen Staff Guidelines

1. Provide nutritious and well balanced meals
2. Implement and maintain New Hampshire health and safety laws and regulations, including those specifying the number of people allowed in the Kitchen.
3. Maintain cleanliness, sanitation and quality assurance
4. Coordinate with nursing staff with regard to food allergies
5. Kitchen director to create menu, purchase and transportation of all food, beverages and supplies.
6. Only appointed Kitchen Staff allowed in kitchen at all times

Lifeguard Guidelines

1. Must possess current Red Cross certification
2. Must be First Aid and CPR certified

3. Provide a safe environment at the lake front and docks—including sun exposure and hydration
4. Oversee any boating activities
5. Perform swim tests prior to each group’s initial swim activity
6. Knowledge of scheduled activities

Nurse Guidelines

1. Implement health and safety rules and regulations for all campers
2. Must be licensed and have BLS/CPR certification
3. Review all health forms prior to the start of camp and notify the Kitchen Director of all food allergies and special diets
4. Prioritize campers with special needs
5. Provide nursing skills regarding every aspect of campers needs
6. Knowledge of local emergency facility—including contact numbers and web-sites.

Support Staff Guidelines

1. Maintain availability at all times
2. Help with any needed set-up for activities
3. Supply firewood and maintain safety at campfires
4. Be available to substitute for counselors on an “as needed” basis
5. Maintain cleanliness of common areas
6. Set a positive example for all campers
7. All staff members shall exhibit the same behavior towards all campers, consistent with Christian love and these guidelines, so that no camper may feel isolated or alienated from others.

POLICIES

Dress Code for Women and Girls

1. Long sleeve shirts, long skirts and head-coverings for chapel
2. No spaghetti straps or halter tops at camp
3. Skirts/shorts should be at least to the fingertips
4. No v-neck or low cut shirts or dresses
5. One-piece swimsuits are required
6. No clothing is permitted which displays political slogans or messages

Dress Code for Men and Boys

1. Long pants and long sleeved shirts for chapel
2. No inappropriate graphic shirts
3. No tank-tops or muscle shirts
4. No hats in the dining hall or chapel
5. No clothing is permitted which displays political slogans or messages

Curfew

1. All campers will be in their cabin at the end of campfire (assigned times by age)
2. Staff will be required to be in their cabins by midnight

Chapel

Clergy, staff and campers are required to attend all services

Cell Phone and Electronic Devices

1. Use of cell phones and all electronic devices during camp will not be allowed
2. Devices must be stored by camp directors
3. Staff is allowed limited cell phone use.
4. No cell phone use by any staff during dining hall, library, chapel and talks.
